# **Grade 9/10 Integrated Arts**

**Open Level** 

Course Code: ALC10/20 Prerequisite: None

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Wellington Heights Secondary School (UGDSB) Semester 1 2022-2023

## **Description/Rationale**

This course integrates two or more of the arts (dance, drama, media arts, music, and visual arts), giving students the opportunity to produce and present integrated artworks created individually and collaboratively. Students will demonstrate innovation as they learn and apply concepts, styles, and conventions unique to the various arts and acquire skills that are transferable beyond the classroom. Students will use the creative process and responsible practices to explore solutions to integrated arts challenges.

# **Big Ideas**

- Using artistic forms, styles, and conventions can help to convey a message
- Analyzing and reflecting on my own work and the work of others is part of the creative process
- Art can build connections, create a community, and foster empathy and understanding

### 1. Essentials & Tableaux

Students will learn about the essential elements of creating various forms of art. They will then explore the basics of stage performance by collaboratively creating a series of tableaux inspired by a song.

## 2. Mime

Students will learn about communicating clearly to an audience through exploring the conventions of mime as an art form. Students will then create and perform their own comedic mime piece.

**Assessment: Mime Performance & Reflection** 

## 3. Soundscapes & Radio Plays

Students will explore the use of sound in storytelling, and techniques for creating practical sound effects. Students will demonstrate their knowledge of the conventions of radio plays through a performance made up entirely of voice and sound.

Assessment: Group Soundscape, Radio Play Performance & Reflection

### 4. Greek Theatre

Students will learn about the origins of theatre as a form of ritual, and collaboratively create performances that incorporate sound, rhythm, movement, and storytelling as a representation of a Greek god.

**Assessments: Ritual Performance & Reflection** 

## 5. Music Videos

Students will analyze music videos as a form of art. They will collaboratively record a cover of a song, then individually plan and film their own music video to accompany the song.

Assessments: Song Cover, Music Video & Reflection

## 6. Anthology (Culminating)

Students will contribute an individual artistic piece to a collaborative anthology. The anthology will be connected together by an overarching theme selected by the students. Students will then reflect on their anthology piece as well as their overall learning and progress throughout the course.

**Assessments: Anthology Contribution, Reflection** 

# **Late Policy**
